THE BEST OF BURHAM The volunteer mum that became the lead Auntie



Auntie Tracev started at the Burham with both parents often working. pre-school in 2003 as a volunteer mum helping out with the snack bar and story time. The pre-school has a long history in the village that goes back over 50 years and for a long time used to be run in the old Village Hall by Pauline Cable. Tracey took over as the supervisor in 2007 and with her dedicated team provides a warm, safe haven for little ones to play and learn to socialise.

The pre-school provides a five day service from an 8.30am drop-off to a pickup at 3pm to cater for modern day requirements. There are over 50 children on roll with a catchment drawn from most of the local villages as well as Burham. When Tracey started mums would send toddlers for a few hours a week, nowadays

children are often left in her charge for 3+ davs.

Tracev draws a distinction between pre-schools and nurseries and feels strongly that helping little ones achieve and socialise is paramount in their development and she was touched this year when parents, who she had looked after as tinv tots when she first started at Burham preschool, enrolled their own off-spring!

Although the pressures are much greater than previously, particularly the admin demands of Ofsted, Tracey and her deputy Auntie Tanya, remain bubbly and cheerful and can be found around 6ish every weekday morning starting to prepare for another day of excitement and adventure!

THE BEST OF BURHAM Twenty years of serving Happy meals



The Happy House Chinese Takeaway has been in the village for since 2006. The Wong family have been serving Burham and the surrounding area for almost 20 years specialising in Cantonese cuisine, with a diverse mix of other Asian influences on the menu.

Ka Yi and her husband Kam Wah came from Hong Kong in the late 1980s and initially settled in London. Although Ka Yi had some previous experience in the industry, having worked in her family's business, neither had run a restaurant before so the Happy House was a big step for them to take.

Their daughter Joanna, recently graduated with a degree in Architecture, is also part of the team and will be well known to anyone that has been to the Happy House. Their working day starts at 11am - apart from Tuesdays - when they prepare for the evening opening. They are busiest at the weekends and ensuring everyone is properly served at peak times can be be challenging but also satisfying when customers leave with a smile! Happy House has always made an effort to be there for those in the village looking for a comforting evening meal or a convenient late-night takeaway.

A family affair Joanna, Ka Yi & Kam Wah

Over the years, the business has evolved in response to changing customer habits. When they first opened most people were locally based and collected their food orders often walking, nowadays they deliver about half their orders and their customers are drawn from a much wider area. They still have a strong core of customers from the village that like to pop-in for a chat and takeaway but delivery is the preferred option for areas like Peters Village. and Snodland. The Covid lockdown was particularly difficult and they did their best to serve vulnerable customers as best they could under the prevailing regulations. Another significant change has been the move away from paying by cash over the years, which was accelerated by Covid, with card payment being the preferred method.

Kai Yi and Kam Wah were attracted to Burham because of the rural setting and warm community spirit and through their hard work and industry have become an important part of the community. With their daughter Joanna, they have served thousands of customers over the years and they remain optimistic about the future and the opportunities that it may bring.

Rev Naomi Oates is a familiar figure in around the village often to be seen in a bright yellow jacket as she whizzes from village to village on her bike. She covers an enormous patch that includes Burham, Eccles, parts of Maidstone and East Malling. Hextable (near Swanley) was recently added to her responsibilities!

We met at the monthly Country Lunch, organised by Eileen Smith, where Naomi helped serve hearty bowls of soup with enthusiasm and a beatific smile that helped lift the spirits of all those present. Since the closure of The Church in Burham, the grief at the loss of a physical presence is being assuaged by strengthening an outreach programme which includes a monthly Book Exchange, a Cafe Church (a joint Methodist and Anglican initiative) as well as regular gatherings at St Mary's, the old church by the river, in addition to the increasingly popular lunches which offered two options for puddings with a choice of custard or ice cream (or both) on the day I attended!

Naomi's early years were spent in Liverpool and her mother became a Methodist Minister when she was seven. The church was always an

important part of her life and at the age of seventeen she became a Local Preacher, a person who has been recognised by the Methodist Church to lead worship and preach the gospel.

Naomi graduated with an Art and English Literature degree from Aberystwyth university and as she always wanted to work with children an early ambition was to become a children's writer. However with her love of preaching, and bringing people together, it was only a question of time before she got the calling and in 2019 she was appointed to oversee the Circuit (area) that she now serves.

Outside her professional life she has two toddlers aged 2 and 4 years and she lists soft play as one of her relaxations. She is also kept on her toes by her eldest who has started asking deep philosophical questions such as 'when Jesus returns and God renews the heavens and earth, will Bob Marley be there?'

Perhaps a little known fact about Naomi is her expertise in Ultimate Frisbee, a skill she honed as a student and now puts to good use at Methodist Camp weekends for young people.

HORTICULTURE Be strong: your plants will love you for it



I don't know about you but I think the hardest thing to learn is to be diligent about thinning out those things you sow direct into the ground in rows. Lettuce, beetroot, radish, parsnip, Swiss Chard, Dwarf French beans and so on. I don't mention carrots as they didn't fare well last year for me so I am trying out a new method, fingers crossed here.

I am getting the hang of it but have to force myself to do it. In reality I think in my heart I feel sorry for the ones that are discarded, but brain into gear here and remember it's done to give the remaining seedlings the space needed to grow. Anyway it works and makes a big difference to the quality of your produce.

This is what I do. You hopefully have a nice thick row of young vigorous plants; as soon as the leaves start to touch, pull out every other one, or as near as possible. Repeat again as and when they start touching again until you reach a spacing that allows them to reach maturity without overlapping too much.

Parsnips and Swiss Chard can end up a foot apart, little gem Lettuce about 6 inches. I find it pays dividends with beetroot that tends to swell more quickly if they have room to grow. I have seen many people leave them in clumps and thin as they use them but I don't think that works as well.

Coupled with this is the temptation to sow too many seeds in the first place, yes I hold my hands up as I have done this and still tend to do it at times. It just makes more work to thinning them out.

Remember, be strong your plants, veg or flower will love you for it



The Anima Appointment & Enquiry System

The new Triage Service 'Anima' system is now active for making appointments and medical queries. The exception is routine repeat prescription requests and long term condition review appointments which will be managed the same as before. Appointments for nursing and healthcare assistant services such as blood tests, smears, dressings, injections and ECG's will still need to be made over the phone initially but will be reviewed in due course. Please visit our website to register and create an Anima account if you have not already done so to enable you to use the service.

Defibrillators - situated at Burham Parish Office. Frost's Service Station. Wouldham Village Hall and the Community Centre, Tolhurst Road, Peters Village. If a machine is needed call 999 for the code and instructions.

Prescriptions - arrangements can be made to have these collected thanks to a service offered by the church. The surgery requires 4 days notice to prepare them and 24 hours notice is required for volunteers to collect them. Village Hall Fencing

The fencing at the rear of the village hall is due to be replaced during May half term. Unfortunately, a large sycamore tree will need to be removed in the process. However, the company that we are using states "for every tree removed, we plant at least one on our land". We don't like removing trees unless absolutely necessary i.e. dead or dangerous but we had no other option so the new fencing could be installed.

Tree Survey

Quotes are being obtained to carry out a survey as there are many trees that the Parish Council has responsibility for. Whilst most are healthy, we suspect that some may be dangerous & have to be removed.

Call for items
